

Isaiah Passages on the Trinity

- Isaiah 1:4 They have forsaken the LORD; they have spurned the Holy One of Israel and turned their backs on him.
- Isaiah 2:3-4 Many peoples will come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob. He will teach us about his ways so that we may walk in his paths." For instruction will go out of Zion and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. He will settle disputes among the nations and provide arbitration for many peoples.
- Isaiah 4:2 On that day the Branch of the LORD will be beautiful and glorious, and the fruit of the land will be the pride and glory of Israel's survivors.
- Isaiah 6:5 My eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty. [context: Is. 6:1-5]
- Isaiah 6:8 I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?"
- Isaiah 7:14 The Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will be with child and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel [God with us].
- Is. 8:13-14 The LORD Almighty is the one you are to regard as holy, he is the one you are to fear, he is the one you are to dread, and he will be a sanctuary; but for both houses of Israel he will be a stone that causes men to stumble and a rock that makes them fall.
- Isaiah 9:6-7 For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The zeal of the LORD Almighty will accomplish this.
- Isaiah 10:17 Israel's Light will become a fire, and its Holy One a flame.
- Is. 11:1-3 A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit. The Spirit of the LORD will rest on him—the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of power, the Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the LORD—and he will delight in the fear of the LORD. [context: Is. 11:1-16]
- Isaiah 12:2 Surely God is my salvation; I will trust and not be afraid. The LORD, the LORD, is my strength and my song; he has become my salvation.
- Isaiah 16:5 In love a throne will be established; in faithfulness a man will sit on it—one from the house of David—one who in judging seeks justice and speeds the cause of righteousness.
- Is. 17:7,10 In that day men will look to their Maker and turn their eyes to the Holy One of Israel. ... You have forgotten God your Savior; you have not remembered the Rock, your fortress.

- Is. 19:19-20 In that day there will be altar to the Lord in the heart of Egypt, and a monument to the LORD at its border. It will be a sign and witness to the LORD Almighty in the land of Egypt. When they cry out to the LORD because of their oppressors, he will send them a Savior and Defender, and he will rescue them.
- Is. 22:21-25 He will be a father to those who live in Jerusalem and to the house of Judah. I will place on his shoulder the key to the house of David; what he opens no one can shut, and what he shuts no one can open. I will drive him like a peg into a firm place; he will be a seat of honor for the house of his father. All the glory of his family will hang on him: its offspring and offshoots—all its lesser vessels, from the bowls to all the jars. “In that day,” declares the LORD Almighty, “the peg driven into the firm place will give way; it will be shattered off and will fall, and the load hanging on it will be cut down.” The LORD has spoken.
- Is. 24:15-16 Exalt the name of the LORD, the God of Israel, in the islands of the sea. From the ends of the earth we hear singing: “Glory to the Righteous One.”
- Isaiah 25:8-9 He will swallow up death forever. The Sovereign LORD will wipe away tears from all faces; he will remove the disgrace of his people from all the earth.
- Is. 26: 4, 7 Trust in the LORD forever, for the LORD, the LORD, is the Rock eternal. ... O upright One, you make the way of the righteous smooth.
- Isaiah 26:13 O LORD, our God, other lords besides you have ruled over us, but your name alone do we honor.
- Is. 28:16 So this what the Sovereign LORD says: “See, I say a stone in Zion, a test stone, a precious cornerstone for a sure foundation; the one who trusts will never be dismayed.
- Isaiah 28:21 The LORD will rise up as he did at Mount Perazim, he will rouse himself as in the Valley of Gibeon—to do his work, his strange work; and perform his task, his alien task.
- Isaiah 28:26 His God instructs him and teaches him the right way.
- Isaiah 32:15 till the Spirit is poured upon us from on high, and the desert becomes a fertile field, and the fertile field seems like a forest.
- Isaiah 33:2 O Lord, be gracious to us; we long for you. Be our strength every morning, our salvation in time of distress.
- Isaiah 33:17 Your eyes will see the King in his beauty; you will see a vast land.
- Isaiah 33:22 For the LORD is our Judge, the LORD is our Lawgiver, the LORD is our King. He will save us.
- Is. 35:2, 4 They will see the glory of the LORD, the splendor of our God. ... Say to the cowardly: “Be strong: do not fear! Here is your God; vengeance is coming. God’s retribution is coming; he will save you.”
- Is. 40:3-5 “In the desert prepare the way of the LORD; make straight in the wilderness a highway for our God. Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill make low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain. And

the glory of the LORD will be revealed, and all mankind together will see it. For the mouth of the LORD has spoken.”

- Is. 40:9-11 Say to the towns of Judah, “Here is your God!” See, the Sovereign Lord comes with power, and his arm rules for him. See, his reward is with him, and his recompense accompanies him. He tends his flock like a shepherd: He gathers the lambs in his arms and carries them close to his heart; he gently leads those that have young.
- Is. 40:13-14 Who has understood the Spirit of the LORD, or instructed him as his counselor? Whom did the LORD consult to enlighten him, and who taught him the right way? Who was it that taught him knowledge or showed him the path of understanding?
- Isaiah 40:25 “To whom will you compare me? Or who is my equal?” says the Holy One.
- Isaiah 41:14 Do not fear, you worm of Jacob, you men of Israel. I will help you—this is the LORD’s declaration. Your Redeemer is the Holy One of Israel.
- Isaiah 42:1-4 Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him and he will bring justice to the nations. He will not shout or cry out, or raise his voice in the streets. A bruised reed he will not break, and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out. In faithfulness he will bring forth justice; he will not falter or be discouraged till he establishes justice on earth. In his law the islands will put their hope.
- Is: 42:6-7 I the LORD have called you in righteousness; I will take hold of your hand. I will keep you and will make you to be a covenant for the people and a light to the Gentiles, to open eyes that are blind, to free captives from prison and to release from the dungeon those who sit in darkness.
- Is. 42:19 Who is blind but my servant, and deaf like the messenger I send? Who is blind like the one committed to me, blind like the servant of the LORD?
- Is. 43:3 For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, and your Savior.
- Is. 43:10-11 “You are my witnesses,” declares the LORD, “and my servant whom I have chosen, so that you may know and believe me and understand that I am he. Before me no god was formed, nor will there be one after me. I, even I, am the Lord, and apart from me there is no savior.
- Isaiah 43:14 This is what the LORD says—your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel:
- Isaiah 44:3 For I will pour water on the thirsty land and streams on the dry ground; I will pour out my Spirit on your descendants and my blessing on your offspring.
- Isaiah 44:6 Thus says the LORD, the King of Israel and his Redeemer, the LORD of hosts: I am the first and I am the last; apart from me there is no God. (NASB)
- Is.44:24 This is what the LORD says—your Redeemer, who formed you in the womb: I am the LORD, who has made all things, who alone stretched out the heavens, who spread out the earth by myself.
- Is. 45:5 I am the LORD, and there is no other; apart from me there is no God.
- Is. 45:6 I am the LORD, and there is no other.

- Is. 45:14-15 They will confess to you, “God is indeed with you, and there is no other; there is no other God.” Yes, you are a God who hides, God of Israel, Savior.
- Is. 45:18 I am the LORD, and there is no other.
- Is. 45:21 There is no God apart from me, a righteous God and a Savior; there is none but me.
- Is. 45:24 In the LORD alone are righteousness and strength. ...In the LORD all the descendants of Israel will be found righteous and will exult.
- Is. 46:9 I am God, and there is no other; I am God, and there is none like me.
- Is. 47:4 Our Redeemer—the LORD Almighty is his name—the Holy One of Israel.
- Is. 48:12 I am he; I am the first and I am the last.
- Is. 48:16-17 And now the Sovereign LORD has sent me, with his Spirit. This is what the LORD says—your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel; I am the LORD your God.
- Is. 49:4-9 What is due me is in the LORD’s hand, and my reward is with my God. And now the LORD says—he who formed me in the womb to be his servant to bring Jacob back to him and gather Israel to himself, for I am honored in the eyes of the LORD and my God has been my strength—he says: “It is too small a thing for you to be my servant to restore the tribes of Jacob and bring back those of Israel I have kept. I will also make you a light for the Gentiles, that you may bring my salvation to the ends of the earth.” This is what the LORD says—the Redeemer and Holy One of Israel—to him who was despised and abhorred by the nations, to the servant of rulers: “Kings will see you and arise, princes will see and bow down, because of the LORD, who is faithful, the Holy One of Israel, who has chosen you. This is what the LORD says: “In the time of my favor I will answer you, and in the day of salvation I will help you; I will keep you and make you to be a covenant for the people, to restore the land and to reassign its desolate inheritances, to say to the captive, ‘Come out,’ and to those in darkness, ‘Be free!’
- Is. 49:26 I, the LORD, am your Savior, your redeemer, the Mighty One of Jacob.
- Is. 50:4-9 The Sovereign LORD has given me an instructed tongue, to know the word that sustains the weary. He wakens me morning by morning, wakens my ear to listen like one being taught. The Sovereign LORD has opened my ears, and I have not been rebellious; I have not drawn back. I offered my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who pulled out my beard; I did not hide my face from mocking and spitting. Because the Sovereign LORD helps me, I will not be disgraced. Therefore have I set my face like flint, and I know I will not be put to shame. He who vindicates me is near. Who then will bring charges against me? Let us face each other! Who is my accuser? Let him confront me! It is the Sovereign LORD who helps me. Who is he that will condemn me? They will all wear out like a garment; the moths will eat them up.
- I.52:13–53:12 See, my servant will act wisely; he will be raised and lifted up and highly exalted. Just as there were many who were appalled at him—his appearance was so disfigured beyond that of any man and his form marred beyond human likeness—so will he sprinkle many nations, and kings will shut their mouths because of him. For what they were not told, they will see, and what they have not heard, they will understand. Who has believed our message and to whom has the arm

of the LORD been revealed? He grew up before him like a tender shoot, and like a root out of dry ground. He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him. He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows, and familiar with suffering. Like one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not. Surely, he took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, yet we considered him stricken by God, smitten by him, and afflicted. But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed. We all like sheep have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth. By oppression and judgment, he was taken away. And who can speak of his descendants? For he was cut off from the land of the living; for the transgression of my people he was stricken. He was assigned a grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death, though he had no violence, nor was any deceit in his mouth. Yet it was the LORD's will to crush him and cause him to suffer, and though the LORD makes his life a guilt offering, he will see his offspring and prolong his days, and the will of the LORD will prosper in his hand. After the suffering of his soul, he will see the light of life and be satisfied; by his knowledge my righteous servant will justify many, and he will bear their iniquities. Therefore, I will give him a portion among the great, and he will divide the spoils with the strong, because he poured out his life unto death, and was numbered with the transgressors. For he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

- Isaiah 54:5 Indeed, your husband is your Maker—his name is the LORD Almighty—and the Holy One of Israel is your Redeemer; he is called the God of the whole earth.
- Is. 55:3-4 I will make an everlasting covenant with you, my unfailing kindnesses promised to David. See, I have made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander of the peoples.
- Isaiah 59:16 He saw that there was no one, and he was appalled that there was no one to intercede; so his own arm worked salvation for him, and his own righteousness sustained him.
- Is. 59:19-20 They will fear the name of the LORD in the west and his glory in the east, for he will come like a rushing stream driven by the wind of the LORD. "The Redeemer will come to Zion, and to those in Jacob who turn from transgression." This is the LORD's declaration.
- Isaiah 60:9 Yes, the coasts and island will wait for me with the ships of Tarshish in the lead, to bring your children from far away, their silver and gold with them, for the honor of the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, who has glorified you.
- Isaiah 60:16 You will nurse on the milk of nations, and nurse at the breast of kings; you will know that I, the LORD, am your Savior and Redeemer, the Mighty One of Jacob.
- Is. 61:1-3 The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me, because the LORD has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom to the captives and release for the prisoners, to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn, and provide for those who grieve in Zion—to bestow on them a crown of

beauty instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair.

- Is. 62:11-12 Look, the LORD has proclaimed to the ends of the earth, "Say to the daughter of Zion: Look your salvation is coming, his wages are with him, and his reward accompanies him." And they will be called the Holy People, the LORD's Redeemed; and you will be called Cared For, A City Not Deserted.
- Is. 63:8-11 He said, "They are indeed my people, children who will not be disloyal," and he became their Savior. In all their suffering, he suffered, and the angel of his presence saved them. He redeemed them because of his love and compassion; he lifted them up and carried them all the days of the past. But they rebelled and grieved his Holy Spirit. So, he became their enemy and fought against them. The he remembered the days of the past, the days of Moses and his people. Where is he who brought them out of the sea with the shepherds of his flock? Where is he who put his Holy Spirit among the flock?
- Is. 63:14-16 Like cattle that go down into the valley, the Spirit of the LORD gave them rest. You led your people this way to make a glorious name for yourself. Look down from heaven and see from your lofty home—holy and beautiful. Where is your zeal and your might? Your yearning and your compassion are withheld from me. Yet you are our Father, your name is Our Redeemer from Ancient Times.
